Note: 1. In 31 A.D. ALL ceremonial Sabbaths fell on seventh-day Sabbaths.

2. Hebrew months were 29 or 30 days each. Their years consisted of 12 lunar months or of 354 1/4 days.

Therefore, about every three years (7 times in 19 years) the 13th month, VEADOR (also called Second ADAR) is added between ADAR and NISAN. It is known as an "intercalary month"
